According to ICA it has devoted the whole of the month of May for providing training to diverse groups of people living with disabilities, school teachers, development workers. young people. women and Rotarians through social artistry initiatives.

For this, international trainers will be facilitating the series of training programmes throughout the month. Dr. Tatwa Prasad Timsina, Chairman of ICA Nepal told The Rising Nepal.

International trainers, such as Janet Sanders from the USA and Evelyn Philbrook from Taiwan, along with their Nepal counterparts, have been facilitating a series of training sessions.
